Connecting with our Community



Teme Class

How can you support learning at home this week?

- Focus on hearing the initial sound in a word, for example: When looking at the illustrations in your child's books, you might ask "grass, what sound can you hear at the start/ end of g-r-a-ss?" Your child may be ready to segment other sounds that they can hear in the words. Practise using 'sound buttons on their arm' to segment the sounds
- Counting to 10 and writing each number. Can you find any numbers in your house? Can you find any objects to represent a number? See Class Dojo for our number formation rhymes.
- If your child draws a picture of something, encourage them to identify the sound the word starts with and write it next to their drawing.



Rea Class



Year 1 homework is reading regularly (four times per week), and spellings. Parents please look in the back of reading records for their tricky word spellings. Words highlighted in green are words that they can confidently spell in class. Words with a star next to them are words that they need to practise at home. We recommend a short session each day. They can practise writing the words in different colours, or you can help them by using look, say, cover, write, check. These are the tricky every day words that they need to use in their writing.

Year 2 homework is Mathletics, a short writing piece,

handwriting, spelling practice (again this can be found in the back of your child's reading record) and regular reading.

Phonics for year 1 next week will be the split digraphs: o-e phone home and u-e huge brute. We will recap tricky words learnt this term.

Phonics/spellings for year 2 will be homophones hear/hear, sun/son, and won/one, kn and gn at the beginning of words and continued work on our tricky spellings.
