Staff and I have been very impressed by the engagement at home. The learning packs that came in were a credit to pupils and parents. Achievers is re-instated this week and will be celebrating, equally, those at home and those at school. Well done everyone as it is really good to know we can keep this going so children are disadvantaged as little as possible.

Below are key updates:

From next week staff have been provided with lateral flow tests to conduct twice weekly. It is good to have another measure to try and support keeping the virus out of the school environment.

Learning Pack Arrangements:

- Arrangements seemed to work well last week so we will keep to the same routine. Where possible, we will aim for packs to be ready from 3pm to support collection by Nursery parents. Drop off and collection points as before.
- PLEASE SANITISE HANDS BEFORE COLLECTING AND DROPPING OFF PACKS (BOTTLES WILL BE AVAILABLE AT DROP OFF POINTS)
- IF YOU ARE ISOLATING (DUE TO CLOSE CONTACT OR POSITIVE RESULT) PLEASE LET US KNOW AND DO NOT COME UP IN PERSON TO COLLECT YOUR PACK. PLEASE GET A FRIEND OR NEIGHBOUR TO HELP AND DROP PACKS AT YOUR DOOR OR LIAISE WITH US AS APPROPRIATE. CHILDREN'S WORK SHOULD NOT COME BACK TO SCHOOL UNTIL AFTER THE 10 DAYS ISOLATION SO KEEP IT AT HOME AND WE WILL VALUE AND MARK IT AT A LATER DATE.
- Shropshire have issued the advice to the right. If you feel this relates to you, or someone in your family, you select the option 'My local council or health protection team has asked me (or someone I live with) to get a test, even though I do not have the symptoms' when you book a test online. The longer we can keep this out of the school, the more effective we can be in keeping everyone safe and delivering education. Thank you all for your support.
- Reading book vouchers: We are continuing this scheme. Children in school will be checked as usual. Home learners please continue to log in your reading records and we will check and acknowledge when you return to school. Thank you to FOSPS for continuing to fund this.

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approach parents to see if we can co-ordinate days and times in order to ensure that children aren't just attending on their own and to support the viability of provision.

Free School Meals (FSM)

Parents/Carers who believe their child may be eligible for free school meals should make an application online through the Shropshire Council Website. This not only benefits parents by funding of a school lunch but it also, currently, gives access to the voucher scheme (£15 per child per week). Parents registered for FSM also brings extra income into the school to support children. The process is confidential.

The Council is now using a new system for free school meals applications that can provide an initial assessment of your eligibility automatically.

School Lunches

With regard to ordering lunches:

• Would you please select your child's choice of sandwich on the Squid payment system. If your child is in Reception / Y1 or Y2 they will qualify for the UFSM (Universal Free School Meal) - however, packed lunches to be provided for Nursery children and Y3/Y4/Y5 & Y6 will be chargeable. The charge will be £2.30 per lunch.

If you do not place an order on Squid for a packed lunch, we will assume that you will provide a packed lunch for your child.

We cannot guarantee a lunch will be provided if you have not ordered it on the Squid system. It is therefore essential that orders are placed on the Squid system, please order for the week—this enables the kitchens to plan supplies.

Please DO NOT order any further than 12th February.
