COVID UPDATE

We continue to have confirmed cases being identified. We are not the only school having this difficulty. As of Wednesday, there were 103 schools in Shropshire in the same position. Following the advice below is crucial:

- Close contacts are now the whole school. Everyone is strongly recommended to do daily LFD tests until further notice (which will be when cases decline below the threshold)
- If you have symptoms (3 Covid or precautionary) you are advised to do a PCR test.
- If you have a positive LFD result you should isolate. People (vaccinated and children) who are self-isolating with COVID-19 can now reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with a lateral flow device (LFD) test on both day 5 and day 6 and they do not have a temperature. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6. The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day.

Daily Reflection or Prayer

We have carried on our justice theme remotely by considering:

 How we sometimes have to adjust to make things fair and inclusive for disabled people. We also reflected on a lovely friendship where the disability wasn't seen.....'what really contributes to their friendship is that Paul doesn't see Kamden's

> disability. He sees him as Kamden'. Classes were all given story books to help us reflect on issues of 'everyone different, everyone welcome'.






Everyone different, everyone welcome.


Rea Class Visit
