

• Open the Book bought us the story of 'Jesus is baptised' which also made us reflect on ideas of people growing up (Jesus was around 30) and people that are special to us.



Phonics and spelling.

Year 1 will bring home spellings on Monday based on this week's phonics lessons 'su' making the 'zh' sound, 'dge' making j and 'ge' making j.

Year 1 phonics next week will be different ways of reading the sh sound (ti, si, ssi and ci) and reading tricky words: busy, beautiful, pretty, hour, any, many and through.

Year 2 spellings will be sent home on Monday and will be words with the suffixes 'ment' and 'less' that children have been learning this week.

Year 2 phonic and spellings next week will be 'l' sound spelt with the grapheme 'al' at the end of some words. This spelling of 'l' at the end of words is less common than 'll'. 'el' and 'le'.

PLEASE ENSURE CHILDRENS READING RECORDS AND READING BOOKS ARE BOUGHT INTO SCHOOL EVERYDAY.

Severn Valley Railway trip

Rea class will be going on their Severn Valley Railway trip on Friday 24th June. Children will be bringing home with them tonight a free commemorative book to mark Queen Elizabeth's Platinum Jubilee. Designed as an official once-in-a-lifetime commemoration of the Platinum Jubilee and written in collaboration with royal experts and historians, the book tells the story of a young girl, Isabella, visiting her Great Granny Joyce who tells her about the Queen and this year's Jubilee.

The book was commissioned by the UK Government and is being published by DK Books. It has been designed for a reading age of nine to 10 years, but will be accessible to all primary school age children, for example if parents, carers or teachers read with them.

A big thank you to Emma Crook, who very kindly came in to do terracotta modelling with the children in gardening club on Wednesday this week.




Teme Class: <u>Maia</u> for building up her confidence when swimming, and her approach to new challenges given to her.
