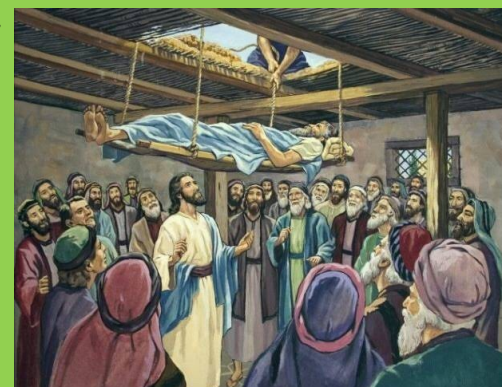

### Daily Reflection or Worship:

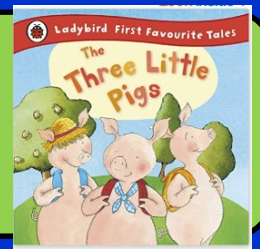
This week:

- W/C 30th August

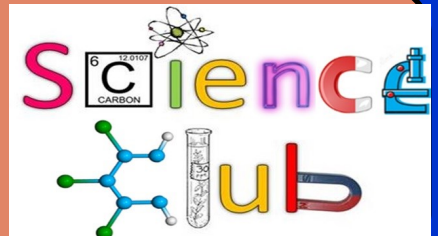

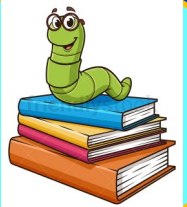

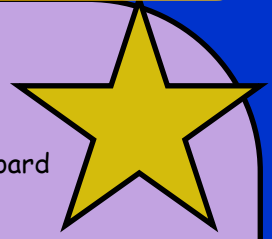
