Daily Reflection or Worship:

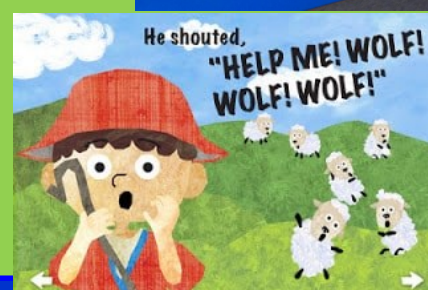
This week:

- Open the Book bought us the story of 'Storm on the lake' and we thought about who is there for us when we are worried or afraid. Children reflected that they are never alone.



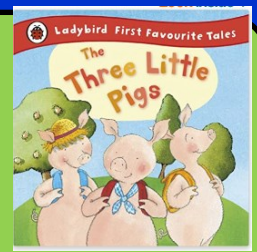

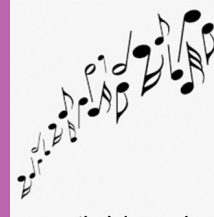

Wednesday 20th July, last day of term, will be a non-uniform day.

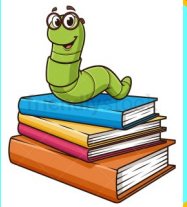

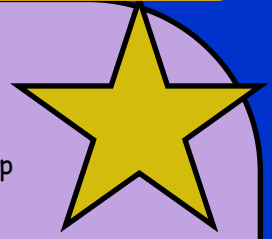
