A bylance of enjoyment of books (any books – sharing books) and a systematic program (decodable books) to be confident with the mechanics



Ensuring children become fluent (carefully taught mechanics and practice) and engaged readers at the very earliest stages also helps avoid the vicious circle of reading difficulty and demotivation that makes later intervention more challenging.

We know that emotional engagement is the tipping point between leaping into the reading life or remaining in a childhood bog where reading is endured only as a means to other

Parents who engage their children in books prepare them to become committed, enthusiastic

Book related talk introduces children to language they might not hear in ordinary conversation.

Research looking at the impact of parents reading with their children by 5 years old. Number of words encountered:

- Never read to: 4662 words
- 1 2 times a week: 63.570 words
- 3 5 times a week: 169 520 words
- Daily: 296,660 words
- 5 books a day:1, 483, 300 words


Friends of Stottesdon Primary School

Maths in Nursery: Shape Hunt: Circles and Squares- To talk about circles and squares using shape language of straight, corners, round.






EYFS (Nursery and Reception) News

Reception News:

Our Talk for Writing Story: The Three Billy Goats Gruff

Reception have been changing the story map of The Three Billy Goats Gruff to invent a new version. The children enjoyed changing the characters of goats to fairies, dinosaurs, lions, horses etc. Their new version of their story will be available in their book bags to retell at home over the weekend.

In maths, this week, the children have built upon their subitising skills. When we investigated the shapes made by Numberblock Four and had a go at making similar arrangements, the children were developing their skills of 'conceptual' subitising. They are noticing the sub-groups that can be perceived within a larger set and recognise the whole at the same time.







How can you help at home this week?

- Read and share the stories inside your child's reading folder at least 4 times a week.
- Please look inside your child's reading record to find which letter sounds we have learnt this week.
- -Can they spot the tricky words 'I' and 'the' in their library sharing book?

Thursday - sorting words with ay/ai sounds.

Friday - writing sentences with our words.

Tricky words covered next week will be: all, are, I, of, one, here and today.

Spelling and phonics for year 2 will be:

Monday - recapping homophones covered so far this term. (flower, flour, bee, be, sea, see, bare, bear, blue and blew)

Tuesday - tricky words - clapping syllables and highlighting tricky parts of the word.


Wednesday - Teaching look, say, cover, write, check strategy.
