Changes to the length of the school day: SUMMER TERM

Following our consultation, we will be proceeding with our changes to the length of the school day from the start of the summer term (17th April). School will open at 8.40am and children will be expected to be in school by 8.45am. We will then be inline with the Government expectation of a 32.5 hour week for all pupils. The end of the school day will continue to be 3.15pm and Nursery times will also remain the same. We recognise we may need to keep an eye on congestion at morning drop off time and will keep an eye on this.

Talk for Writing: Handa's Surprise

Reception and Nursery have been reading the book 'Handa's Surprise' by Eileen Browne. Handa puts seven delicious fruits in a basket to take to her friend, Akeyo. But as she walks, carrying the basket on her head, various creatures steal her fruits. When she shares her basket with Akeyo, it's Handa who gets the biggest surprise. The story is set in Kenya and has given us opportunities to discuss and investigate the similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.

In phonics:

In Maths

We have been focussing on understanding differences and similarities. Our activities this week developed focus exclusively on the numerosity of sets, without being diverted by colour, shape or size. The children have noticed when quantities are equal or unequal and began to consider how they could manipulate the number of objects in 2 sets to make them equal.





Our maths language focus has been reinforcing the language of 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'an equal number' to describe how many objects there are in each set. 'Fewer than' is used rather than 'less than', as the focus is on countable things.

How can you help at home over the weekend?

- Listen to your child read their school reading book / library book
- Practise reading the tricky words together
- Practise learning to spell / write your child's surname

Rea Class

Phonics for year 1 will be:

Monday - growing the code for oo, with 'ui' as in fruit and 'ou' as in soup.

Tuesday - exploring where in the word the ee sound is: 'ee' sheep, 'ea' wheat, 'e' secret, 'e-e' even, 'ie' field, 'y' hairy and 'ey' money.

Wednesday - exploring where in the word the 's' sound is: 's' saw, 'ss' fussy, 'c' ice , 'se' house and 'ce' fence, and where in the word the 'z' sound is: 'z' zoo, 'zz' fizz, 's' was and 'se' choose.

Thursday - exploring where in the word 'oa' sound is: 'oa' float, 'o' most, 'oe' goes, 'ou' shoulder, 'o-e' alone and 'ow' snow.

Friday is review day.

Spellings for year 2 will be:

Near homophones such as quiet and quite.

Homophones revision such as flour and flower.

Tricky words with the 'oa' sound - most, both and only.

The r sound spelt 'wr' - write etc.



Maths for year 1 will be to continue strategies for bridging ten when adding and subtracting two 1-digit numbers. eg 8 + 4 = 8 + 2 + 2

Maths for year 2 will be to develop strategies for adding and subtracting 2-digit and 1-digit numbers and 2-digit and 2-digit numbers.

On Thursday 26th January FoSPS organised a Quiz night at the Fighting Cocks.


The event proved to be a great success, everyone attending had a very enjoyable time and helped to raise

Staffing Changes from the Summer Term

Following advertisements to replace Mrs King as she retires, we are pleased to announce the following arrangements for the summer term:

- Miss Robinson will become our SENCO (Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator).
- Mr Simpson will be joining us to compliment the teaching team. He will take a lead in teaching French at KS2 and another subject to be confirmed. Increasing our teaching specialists supports staff workload, will facilitate Miss Robinson in her new role and Mrs McKay in her Assistant Headteacher role.
 - Mrs Walker will be altering her timetable to be the Severn Class teaching assistant.
 - Mrs Carter will be altering her timetable to be in Corve Class more full time.
- Mrs Griffiths will be increasing her hours to also provide full time support for Corve Class including pupils with Education and Health Care Plans.

Attendance:

We are seeing a significant increase in pupils with what is called persistent absence. Persistent absence is where a pupils misses 10% or more of school (a day a fortnight). Attendance at this level is, nationally, strongly linked to underachievement and we can see how children are missing out on key learning elements or intervention groups to support them. Whilst we know there are a lot of illnesses going round and we understand these are genuine illnesses, we are also seeing an increase in holidays in term time. Holidays in term time are not an exceptional circumstance and do

Holidays in term time are not an exceptional circumstance and do
significantly disrupt learning patterns. There are 190 school days in an
academic year leaving 175 days free for families and those working in
education to take holidays. Penalties or fines (£120 each parent) will be
issued by the Local Education Authority. Please support us in supporting

above 95% (please see recent reports for your child's figure).

Emergency Closures: Winter Weather Arrangements


As we head deeper into the winter period, we would like to remind parents of the procedure if we need to close the school (due to severe weather, damage to school buildings, loss of utility supplies, difficulty in accessing the site to make it safe). Closure will always be as a last resort to ensure the safety of staff and students. Schools are expected to stay open unless there is no other sensible option than to close and staff know that travel to work / school is regarded by both the police and the Council's Highways Management as an essential journey. However, there may be times when the school feels it is unsafe to be open or needs a delayed start to give more time for staff to travel safely.
