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


Stages of life



Tuesday: Children reflected on the wonder of human life and considered the special time of a new baby





| <p>Maths</p>  | <p>This week in Maths the Reception children have continued to focus on ordinality: considering where numbers to 10 are in relation to each other. Through practical activities and games, the children reasoned about numbers and thought carefully about which is more or less. They used linear number tracks to play games that encourage them to compare numbers that are far apart, near and next to each other. (For example, 10 is a lot more than 2 but 5 is only 1 more than 4.)</p>  |

Rea News

Phonics next week for year 2 will be focusing on the rules for suffixes.

Phonics next week for year 1 will be revision of: 'ph' making the 'f' sound as in phone; 'wh' making the w sound as in white; 'ie' making the ee sound as in shield and 'g' making the j sound as in giant and cage.

Maths next week will be focusing on telling the time, so children wearing watches (not valuable or expensive) would be very helpful. Also, if you can support your child with this at home it will add meaning to their learning. Year one will be focusing on o'clock, half past quarter past and quarter to. Year 2 will be focusing on telling the time to the nearest five minutes on an analogue clock.

Homework for Rea class is:

- Reading regularly (at least four times per week for our stickers). This can include practising tricky words from the back of their reading records or on their karabiners where appropriate.

15 minutes Numbots (TTRS year 2).

Year 4

Attached to the school news is an information leaflet about the year four times tables check, which takes place the first week we come back after half term Summer break. We would like to give your children an extra boost to help practise their times tables. In school, they will be able to attend a times tables rock stars club during the first fifteen minutes of lunch break each day should they wish. Practise on times tables rock stars will also help to improve their speed in answering the questions as the practise helps develop recall of the facts.

Changes to Nursery & Wrap Around prices from September 2023

In order to stay in line with National funding for Nursery places we would like to let everyone know that our hourly charge for Nursery, wrap around and holiday club will be £4.40 from September 2023. (Please note this is for any charges of time above and beyond Nursery funded hours). We hope significant advance notice is appreciated. 

Trips, Visits and other Educational Messages (Please note this now gives you a picture up to the end of the year - the only other thing that may come up is a trip to support pond dipping in Rea Class)

Please find below details of educational trips that we are planning during the summer term.



1 - Severn Class Trip

On Tuesday 18th July 2023, children in Severn Class will be visiting Enginuity. They will be able to explore the museum and attend a 'power buggie' workshop. FoSPS have very kindly covered half of the cost of the transport, we are requesting a voluntary contribution of £12 per child to cover the rest of the cost of the trip - for those children eligible for benefit related FSM this is reduced by 50% to £6.

2 - Corve Class Trip

On Monday 12th June 2023, children in Corve Class will be visiting the Blists Hill Museum in Ironbridge. As well as exploring the museum they will be attending a 'Victorian School' workshop.

FoSPS have very kindly covered half of the cost of the transport, we are requesting a voluntary contribution of £ 19.50 per child to cover the rest of the cost of the trip - for those children eligible for benefit related FSM this is reduced by 50% to £9.75 - (this includes £3 spending money per child which will be converted into coins at the Blists Hill Bank).

Next term we will be taking children in Teme / Rea & Corve classes to Severn Centre, Highley for swimming lessons once a week for a total of 7 weeks.

Rea & Corve Class lessons will be on a Thursday afternoon, on the following dates:

8th / 15th / 22nd & 29th June - 6th / 13th & 20th July


Teme Class lessons will be on a Friday afternoon, on the following dates:
