Children's Reports




New Management Information System

We have begun to explore some songs for our school fetewe look forward to sharing some joy with you....giving our talents.




Wednesday: Open the book brought us the story of 'The Lost Coin' which reminds us how we are all important and that there are special people in our lives (including God) who watch out for us.

Thursday: Children in Reception and KS1 reflected on the wonderful Wimbledon tennis tournament and how we think about competition, winning/loosing and the journey of participating.


Reflection

EYFS (Nursery and Reception) News



Reception news

Talk for Writing: The Everywhere Bear Everywhere Bear	The Everywhere Bear Reception have been learning about the Julia Donaldson book, 'The Everywhere Bear'. In this story, The Everywhere Bear has a wonderful time with the children in Class One, but one day he gets more than he bargained for when he falls unnoticed from a backpack and embarks on his own big adventure. This week, Reception have been taking turns to take home our class bears 'Grandpa and Grandma Bear'.	
Maths: Sand Gnate 10 4 and 1 make 10 2 and 3 make 6 5 while make 5	This week in maths we have been revisiting the number bonds for numbers up to 10. We have been investigating all the possible number bonds by splitting a number into two parts. Then recording our answers on whiteboards. Number bonds are pairs of numbers which make up a total. The number bonds for seven, for example, are 3 + 4, 2 + 5, 1 + 6 and 0 + 7.

Year 2 Spellings Retrieval to end the year will be continuing to practice: apostrophes for contractions; elle and all at the end of words eg medal, jewel and little; dropping the efrom a split digraph when adding a suffix starting with a vowel eg smile becomes smiling and smiled; wr making the r sound as in write; doubling the last letter and adding a suffix starting with a vowel after a short vowel sound followed by a consonant eg bat becomes batter an batted and batting.

Phonics for year one will be:


• ti, ssi, si and ci all making "sh" eg station, mission, mansion and special

End of year messages




Children will be bringing home their exercise books at the end of next week / term - would you please ensure children have a strong carrier bag to transport these books home.

Summer Holiday Fun in Shropshire with HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) – Bookings Open!



Bookings are now open for the Summer Shropshire HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) programme.

There are free places available on the programme for children and young people aged 4 (reception class age) to 16, who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals. There are also a limited number of free places available for children and young people living in areas of high deprivation and/or from low-income households, who are not in receipt of benefits related free school meals. These children and young people can be referred onto the programme by a professional. Places are also available for Ukrainian families, currently staying in Shropshire with host families.

Whether you want to withdraw all or part of your sQuid purse balance, follow the steps below to submit your request to the sQuid Support team.

01 Log in to your sQuid account

Go to portal.squidcard.com/LoginPortal, and enter the requested details to log in to your account.



02 Select the user

Select the user you want to withdraw funds from and within their purse click on the Request a balance withdrawal for this purse link.



03 Enter amount to be withdrawn from the purse

The **available balance** on the purse will be displayed. Simply enter the amount you wish to withdraw and then click the **Withdraw** button, or click the **Withdraw all** button to withdraw the entire balance.



04 Await confirmation

A message will be displayed on-screen to confirm that your balance withdrawal request has been submitted for review and processing by the sQuid Support team.

To view your balance withdrawal requests, go to **Top up** in the main menu bar and then click **View refunds and** withdrawals.

Please note that you can only submit a further balance withdrawal request once an earlier request has been processed.

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Toilet Project at St. Marys Church, Stottesdon

Please see message below from Chris Tibbits regarding the Heritage Project news.

As a school we use the Church a lot, if you are able to support in anyway it would be very welcome.

Here, at last, is an opportunity for everyone in the community to contribute to the project: it has always been our intention to provide a toilet facility as part of the massive restoration investment at St Mary's. Sadly, as much more than planned had to be spent eliminating the dry rot and replacing the roof coverings with 33,000 new tiles, we are **short of between £20-25,000** to meet this most 'basic of needs'. We should explain that, with no mains drainage on site, the loo is not a cheap facility.... it has to be 'off grid' composting toilet since a septic tank is not appropriate in a churchyard. **So this is an urgent call for financial help to complete the job** - we have a most generous grant from the Shropshire Historic Churches Trust and a donation from one local business to get us underway can you help towards the remaining £11-15,000?? Please get in touch if you might be able to assist - and thank you so much for thinking about this!
