New Management Information System: Next Steps



Thank you to all those that have logged into Arbor to explore and amend/add any information. We have almost got everyone on board – around 15 families still to go so we are hopeful this will be

achieved over the weekend. Thank you to those that have let us know that there are problems with the App. We have reported these in (it is not just our school) so Arbor technicians are looking at this. The Arbor Portal is reliable so if we could ask anyone having difficulties to use this until we get feedback. As we learn and build the system to meet our needs, we will be opening different sections. Meals and Wrap Around Care are now open so please see below for instructions for how to start using these. - Top up money to your account using the green buttor:
 If you are eligible for Universal Free
 School Meals (YR/Y1/Y2) or Benefit Related Free School <u>Meals</u> you will not be charged. All other pupils will be charged at £2.50 per meal. Each menu choice is repeated as you will need to select whether you want the menu choice - fruit or the menu choice + the pudding no offer (please <u>note;</u> yoghurt will no longer be available on a daity basis; vegetables are also available for all meals). - You will see the deadline for making choices is 9am each morning as the kitchens <u>pick</u> up the order and cook accordingly.

Homework for Rea class is:


- Reading regularly (at least four times) and practising your sounds from the back of your reading record. As mentioned above, we will change books early next week for the Summer.




Children will be bringing home their exercise books at the end of next week / term - would you please ensure children have a strong carrier bag to transport these books home.

Summer Holiday Fun in Shropshire with HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) – Bookings Open!



Bookings are now open for the Summer Shropshire HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) programme.

There are free places available on the programme for children and young people aged 4 (reception class age) to 16, who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals. There are also a limited number of free places available for children and young people living in areas of high deprivation and/or from low-income households, who are not in receipt of benefits related free school meals. These children and young people can be referred onto the programme by a professional. Places are also available for Ukrainian families, currently staying in Shropshire with host families.


We would like to make you aware that we are in the process of changing our management information system, this will mean that we will be moving away from Squid.

Toilet Project at St. Marys Church, Stottesdon

Please see message below from Chris Tibbits regarding the Heritage Project news.

As a school we use the Church a lot, if you are able to support in anyway it would be very welcome.

Here, at last, is an opportunity for everyone in the community to contribute to the project: it has always been our intention to provide a toilet facility as part of the massive restoration investment at St Mary's. Sadly, as much more than planned had to be spent eliminating the dry rot and replacing the roof coverings with 33,000 new tiles, we are **short of between £20-25,000** to meet this most 'basic of needs'. We should explain that, with no mains drainage on site, the loo is not a cheap facility.... it has to be 'off grid' composting toilet since a septic tank is not appropriate in a churchyard. So this is an urgent call for financial help to complete the job - we have a most generous grant from the Shropshire Historic Churches Trust and a donation from one local business to get us underway can you help towards the remaining £11-15,000?? Please get in touch if you might be able to assist - and thank you so much for thinking about this!
