## New Management Information System: Next Steps



*Thank you to all those that have logged into Arbor to explore and amend/add any information. We have almost got everyone on board – around 15 families still to go so we are hopeful this will be*

achieved over the weekend. Thank you to those that have let us know that there are problems with the App. We have reported these in (it is not just our school) so Arbor technicians are looking at this. The Arbor Portal is reliable so if we could ask anyone having difficulties to use this until we get feedback. As we learn and build the system to meet our needs, we will be opening different sections. Meals and Wrap Around Care are now open so please see below for instructions for how to start using these. Instructions will also be attached to the school news email.

### Meals:

From September these are now booked through Arbor.

- Top up money to your account using the green button: [Top up account](#). If you are eligible for Universal Free School Meals (YR/Y1/Y2) or Benefit Related Free School Meals you will not be charged. All other pupils will be charged at £2.50 per meal. Please note that we are not in a position to allow parents to build up a debt in these accounts – we don't aim to make money but the school meals services made a significant loss this year and the education budget cannot be funding this.
- Begin to select the choices with your children. This includes a home packed lunch so we know that your child will be bringing something from home. If your child is going to have a regular packed lunch [pattern](#) please let us know and we can apply this to the system so it is automatically there. Each menu choice is repeated as you will need to select whether you want the menu choice + fruit or the menu choice + the pudding on offer (please [note](#), yoghurt will no longer be available on a daily basis; vegetables are also available for all meals).
- The menus continue to be on an alternating weekly menu. If you tick 'for all future available [dates](#)' you will be able to select this choice every fortnight for the rest of the term. If you would like to select on a more random basis (rather than a pattern) you can do each week at a time. If you want to change or delete your choice this is also easily done.
- You will see the deadline for making choices is 9am each morning as the kitchens [pick](#) up the order and cook accordingly.
- We strongly recommend the Arbor help centre button in the top right which automatically takes you to help pages for the section you are in on the parent portal. ### Wrap Around Care

- From September these are now booked through Arbor and are within the [clubs](#) link in Quick Actions
- Click on the club you want (booking cut off is at midnight for breakfast club/early start and 2.45pm for after school club)
- Register for the club – the system includes a membership option which allows you to decide to book:
  - o a one off daily session – great for irregular [patterns](#) – all the dates in the year come up!
  - o a weekly set – great if you book every day of the [week](#)
  - o a monthly set – great if you need every day of the [month](#)
  - o a termly [set](#) – great if you book every day of the term.
- Please note that this service does not allow you to book unless you have money on the account.
  - o Children eligible for benefit related free school meals are charged with a 50% discount.
  - o If you are booking more than one [child](#) please book both children and inform us so we can apply a sibling refund (we will aim to do this asap).
  - o If you use vouchers or [15/30 hour](#) funding for payment we will apply these to accounts over the summer and every time funding is agreed/comes into account (please do not worry about missing bookings as there is currently enough space in the system).

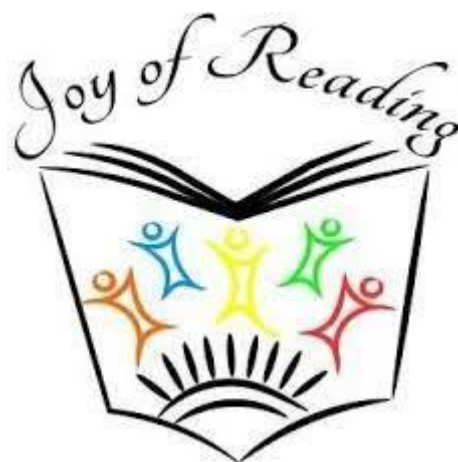

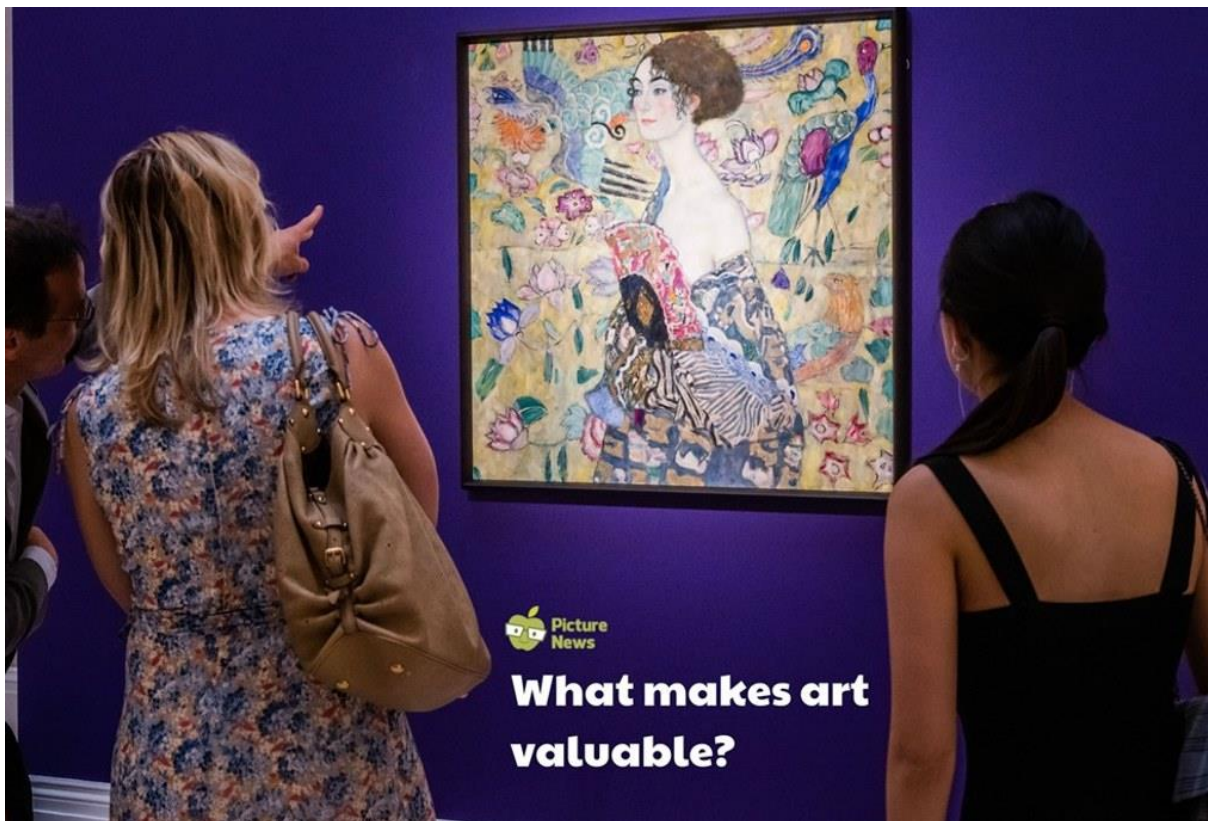
## Our Worship/Reflections this week:

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## **Summer Holiday Fun in Shropshire with HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) – Bookings Open!**



Bookings are now open for the Summer Shropshire HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) programme.

There are free places available on the programme for children and young people aged 4 (reception class age) to 16, who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals. There are also a limited number of free places available for children and young people living in areas of high deprivation and/or from low-income households, who are not in receipt of benefits related free school meals. These children and young people can be referred onto the programme by a professional. Places are also available for Ukrainian families, currently staying in Shropshire with host families.

Go to [portal.squidcard.com/LoginPortal](http://portal.squidcard.com/LoginPortal), and enter the requested details to log in to your account.

#### 02 Select the user

Select the user you want to withdraw funds from and within their purse click on the **Request a balance withdrawal for this purse** link.

#### 03 Enter amount to be withdrawn from the purse

The **available balance** on the purse will be displayed. Simply enter the amount you wish to withdraw and then click the **Withdraw** button, or click the **Withdraw all** button to withdraw the entire balance.

#### 04 Await confirmation

A message will be displayed on-screen to confirm that **your balance withdrawal request has been submitted for review and processing by the sQuid Support team.**

To view your balance withdrawal requests, go to Top up in the main menu bar and then click View refunds and withdrawals.

Please note that you can only submit a further balance withdrawal request once an earlier request has been processed.

## Toilet Project at St. Marys Church, Stottesdon

Please see message below from Chris Tibbits regarding the Heritage Project news.

As a school we use the Church a lot, if you are able to support in anyway it would be very welcome.

**Here, at last, is an opportunity for everyone in the community to contribute to the project:** it has always been our intention to provide a toilet facility as part of the massive restoration investment at St Mary's. Sadly, as much more than planned had to be spent eliminating the dry rot and replacing the roof coverings with 33,000 new tiles, we are **short of between £20-25,000** to meet this most 'basic of needs'. We should explain that, with no mains drainage on site, the loo is not a cheap facility.... it has to be 'off grid' composting toilet since a septic tank is not appropriate in a churchyard. **So this is an urgent call for financial help to complete the job** - we have a most generous grant from the Shropshire Historic Churches Trust and a donation from one local business to get us underway .... can you help towards the remaining £11-15,000?? Please get in touch if you might be able to assist - and thank you so much for thinking about this!
