Notices for consent

We have updated some of the requirements for your consent e.g. First Aid. When in Arbor there is a notices pane on the left with arrows for you to complete these.

Allergies and Medical Conditions please complete so all information is up to date.

*Please click on the View Student Profile button (Bright Green). The notices are also in here but if you scroll down we need parents to make sure they have **filled in any allergies or medical conditions in the medical section.** This is where you can also keep us updated with any changes.*

Meals

Please remember to keep booking meals in advance this really cuts down on lost learning time. If your child always has sandwiches or always has sandwiches on certain days confirm this in an email to Mrs Meredith and she can set it as a pattern.

Wrap Around and Nursery paid sessions

Please remember to book the wrap around sessions in advance. We have some parents/children turning up without booking and if we are full we may have to turn people away due to staffing ratios.

Below is a reminder about how to book wrap around sessions and further information that came out yesterday for parents who have funding arrangements (vouchers; funded childcare). Our terms and conditions are also updated and on our website.

Wrap Around Care

- From September these are now booked through Arbor and are within the [clubs](#) link in Quick Actions
- Click on the club you want (booking cut off is at midnight for breakfast club/early start and 2.45pm for after school club)
- Register for the club – the system includes a membership option which allows you to decide to book:
 - o a one off daily session – great for irregular [patterns](#) – all the dates in the year come up!
 - o a weekly set – great if you book every day of the [week](#)
 - o a monthly set – great if you need every day of the [month](#)
 - o a termly [set](#) - great if you book every day of the term.
- Please note that this service does not allow you to book unless you have money on the account.
 - o Children eligible for benefit related free school meals are charged with a 50% discount.
 - o If you are booking more than one [child](#) please book both children and inform us so we can apply a sibling refund (we will aim to do this asap).
 - o If you use vouchers or [15/30 hour](#) funding for payment we will apply these to accounts over the summer and every time funding is agreed/comes into account (please do not worry about missing bookings as there is currently enough space in the system).

Payment arrangements for Wrap Around when using vouchers (tax free childcare, college childcare funding etc.)

If you require wrap around provision, please proceed and book (the system will now allow you to do this and this will show as a debt). SGET finance team will credit your Arbor account when the voucher is received within our bank account (this is regularly checked throughout the month). **Any outstanding balances (ie over and above any voucher funding) are expected to be cleared on a monthly basis.** Please note that if balances aren't cleared this would affect your ability to book and use the service in subsequent months.

Payment arrangements for Nursery parents who are also using Wrap Around (or extended Nursery hours)

The Nursery termly Parent Declaration Form sets your pattern of use and funding for the term. The office will apply the nursery pattern to the nursery class register. If Nursery 2 (preschool year) parents are using wrap around hours, they will need to book these in advance on Arbor. The cost of any hours above the funded hours (either in the Nursery sessions or in wraparound) will be applied, by the finance team, to that area of Arbor as an invoice for the term (ie Nursery hours or wrap around hours). **Parents are expected to pay off amounts owing over the term.** Please note that if balances aren't cleared this would affect your ability to book and use this additional service in future. Any ad hoc sessions outside of the set termly pattern will need to be emailed to the school office for consideration.

Cancellations

Please note that if people book services but don't turn up they will be charged.

Wraparound: We require 72 hours notice of cancellation in wrap around so that places can be offered and booked by others. Cancellations need to be emailed directly to the school office who will apply refunds if the 72 hours notice period has been met. Exceptional circumstances will be considered at the discretion of the headteacher.

Top tip to paying onto different account areas.

When you are topping up different account areas (wrap around; nursery; meals; trips etc) we recommend putting the top ups into the basket and then paying for them in one go (rather than individually).

Sibling Discount

The sibling discount will be applied, as a credit, the day after children have attended the service that parents have booked. Apologies this cannot be done at the time of booking.

Reading: Why is it important to read regularly?



Giving children the skills to read (mechanics) and inspiring pupils to enjoy and love reading is the single most important thing we can all, collectively, be doing that has huge, long lasting benefits for our children.

This is why children come home with two reading books: one which they can read (which practises the mechanics) and one which is for sharing and enjoyment. Both are really important. We expect children to be reading at home at least 4 times a week (little and often has the most impact - it doesn't matter which book or if it is another at home). Classes will continue to track this and celebrate in the school news and with an additional playtime if the whole team achieves it. Where children aren't doing this crucial regular practice we will use time slots in school (breaktime and lunchtime) to support this vital part of their development.

We are continually supporting reading in school with reading for enjoyment everyday, guided reading and daily phonics in younger classes. We are now also adding weekly class book clubs to help enthuse children about the books they could be reading for enjoyment. We hope to be sharing class top tens with you very soon. Book vouchers funded by FOSPS are going to be used slightly differently as each term classes are going to see the book voucher money as their book budget to spend for the term in order to buy appealing texts for them to enjoy - like their very own bookshop!

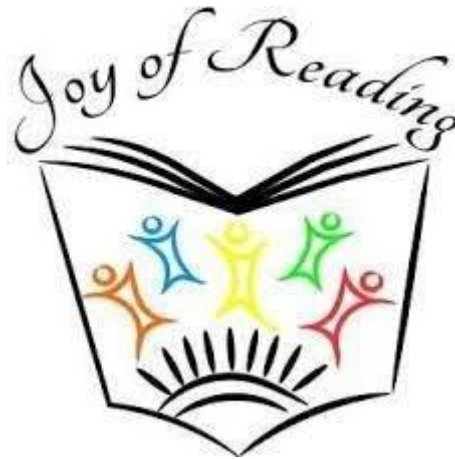

Rea Class

Year 2 phonics will be continuing a phase 5 review. Focus will be:

- alternative graphemes for **or** (for), **aw** (dawn), **a** (water), **au** (autumn), **ore** (before), **oor** (door), **al** (walk), **oar** (board), **ou** (pour), **ough** (daughter) and **aur** (dinosaur).
- alternative graphemes for zh – **si** (explosion) and **su** (casual).
- alternative graphemes for **ch** (chance), **tch** (catch), **ture** (creature).
- alternative graphemes for **sh** (sheep), **ch** (chef) **ssi** (mission) and **si** (mansion)

Year 1 phonics will be introducing some of our new phase 5 graphemes:

- ai (spelt **ay** as in play and may).
- ow (spelt as **ou** as in shout and about).
- oi (spelt **oy** as in joy and toy).
- ee (spelt **ea** as in read and sea).


- **Reading** regularly (at least four times). Well done to everyone who did this week.
- 15 minutes **numbots or using the white rose maths app to practise subitising** 1-minute maths app | White Rose Maths (whiteroseeducation.com)^[1].
- Practise spellings from your homework books. We sound out the word, write it. Then we hide it and your child has a try and writing it. Just a few minutes each day is most effective.

The White Rose 1 minute maths app is available for phones and tables. It focuses on fun mental maths activities that help children recall their number facts.

What's the app about?

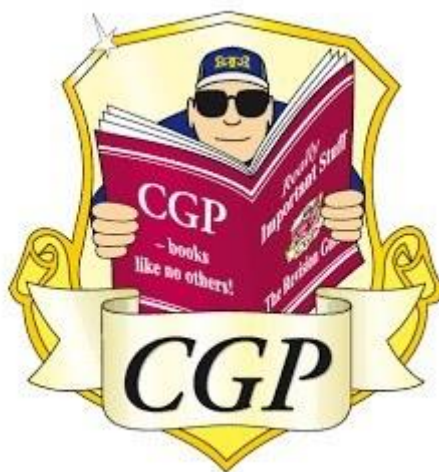
The subitising, addition and subtraction area of the app is aimed at Reception and Key Stage 1 pupils with Individual one-minute tasks focus on adding and subtracting – and on 'Subitising', the skill of instantly recognising the number of items in a group without counting. However, for Key stage 2, practise of facts learnt in earlier years frees up your working memory to access new learning, so it's a great way of keeping up skills. Additionally, multiplication and division topics are also now available!

How do we use it?

Children can choose any topic they want to try. They then answer a unique series of questions (so it's a different set of questions every time). If they're struggling with a question, a 'Hint' button will give a helpful clue by showing the question in a different but familiar way.

When the one minute's up, they'll see a feedback screen telling them how they've done.
