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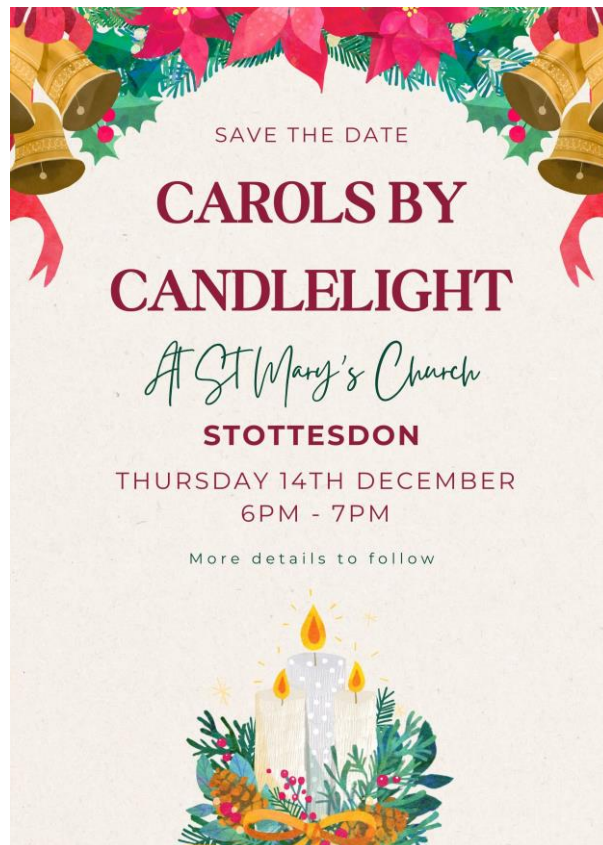

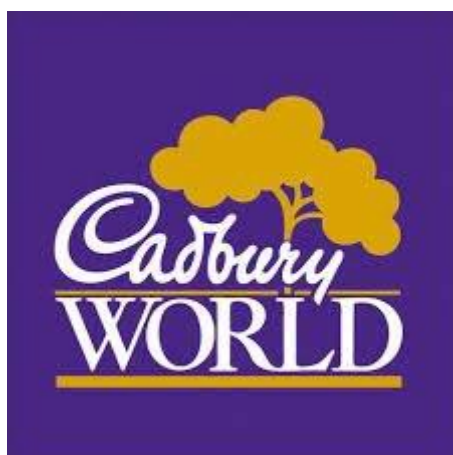

Thursday 6th June - Hampton Court (to include a 1hr workshop - return to Stottesdon

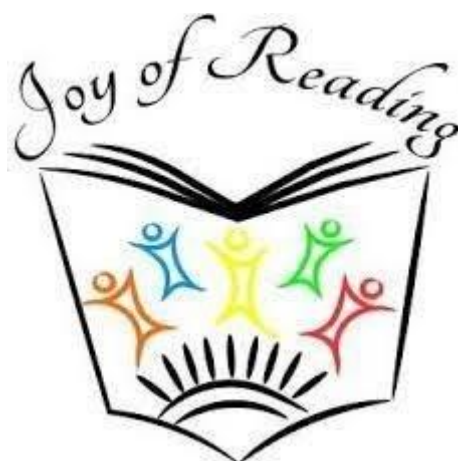
The children will be staying at the London Lee Valley YHA, Windmill Ln, Cheshunt, Waltham Cross EN8 9AJ

By standing and listening out for the colours, you're boosting their concentration skills. Why not let them take the lead and shout out the colours themselves? By letting them take control, you're helping build up their confidence and encouraging them to use words.</p> <p>It's also a great opportunity to teach your child about simple road safety. Next time you are out for a walk after you've played the game, point out any traffic lights that you pass. Can your child remember what the colour means from your game?</p> <p>The most important thing is to have fun with it (and maybe help them use up some of their excess energy).</p>	




Reception news



Talk for Writing: Owl Babies

This week the children have been introduced to a finger space when reading a caption and when writing a caption. Finger spaces refer to the amount of space that needs to be left between words so that they can be read as individual units of meaning. Reception children are first taught to put their finger on the page in between each word, to create the necessary spacing.





When practising letter sounds at home, it's important to pronounce "pure sounds": for example, the sound /m/ is pronounced 'mmm' and not 'muh' or 'em'. 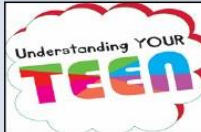
