



If you would like, they will deliver to school; they provide a monthly free delivery. There is an option to deliver or click and collect. If you choose the click and collect option, and add on the notes: deliver to school and the child's name and class, the order will be delivered on the closest delivery run.

Severn Class trip to Cadbury's World








Our Worship/Reflections this week:

The children have explored ways to represent numbers to 5 using both their fingers and the Hungarian number pattern. These key representations will help to underline the 'fiveness' of 5 and provide structures that will support later exploration of its composition and its relationships with other numbers.

Year 2 understanding when to use a double letter in a word (when it protects a short vowel sound) fizz, miss and will and what the exceptions are to this rule.

Year 1 will be continuing phase 5 set 1 sounds with: 'o' making 'oa' as in most and open; 'l' making 'igh' as in kind and tiger; 'a' making 'ai' as in paper and acorn; and 'e' making 'ee' as in fever and being. Year 1 tricky words will be: your people their oh Mr Mrs Ms ask.

Forest Fun Sessions for Reception




Forest Fun sessions for the second half of the autumn term are running on a Tuesday afternoon for just reception only.


