How are children getting online?

PC ; Laptops ; Tablets (Ipads, etc) ; Games consoles (Wii, Playstation, X Box)
; Ipods; E-Readers ; Smartphones ; Smart TV/Blu-ray players

What are the risks?

- Cyber-bullying
- Accessing inappropriate websites
- Accessing content that does not role model positive behaviour; positive sexuality; equality.....
- Losing control over the images and videos they post
- Grooming
- flirty chat – inappropriate language
- Sharing private information – CEOP Jigsaw
- Accessing age inappropriate content
- Becoming addicted, reclusive, unable to choose other pass times

What can you do?

1. Have a 'it could happen' attitude
2. Routines from the start (screen breaks)
3. Online in public places not private
4. Know the passwords – shouldn't be downloading apps independently – be able to check what they are doing
5. Check the history
6. Talk and do with them – think you know films
7. Role model in your own use – be open about it
8. Use control and filters
9. Reporting: school; Ceop; police

Open and shared

- Get them to tell you about the sites they're using. Ask them questions such as:
 - ◦ Why do they like the site?
 - ◦ What can they do on it?
 - ◦ What's so fun about it?
 - ◦ Who uses it at school?
 - ◦ Who you can talk to?
 - ◦ Who are their friends on it?
- Develop a trusting relationship with your child about what they are up to online – start early (it can be really hard to establish if you start too late)
