They swap around - children to describe the animal and adult to guess. (e.g: I am very big, grey, have 2 big ears, 4 legs, a long tail, 2 tusks, love in Africa, have a trunk: I am an......)





School Readiness Activities:

(Pre-school children)

*Dressing yourself, putting your own socks and shoes on and doing up a zip.

*Being able to use the toilet on your own, including washing and drying hands on my own.

*Cut up own food or open some wrappers/packets myself.

*Talk about what I like and dislike.

*Be able to listen to others and take turns in conversations.

*Be interested in listening to stories and looking at pictures in books.

*Understand and follow some rules.

*Be able to talk about myself and my feelings.
