Personal, Social and Emotional

*Using any animal teddies ypu have can you make them a home modelled on their homes in the environment?

A nest for a bird, a den for a fox or lion, what other homes can you think of?

Communication and Language

*Talk about the different homes you see in your street/town/village?

Big houses, small, houses, campervans, flats, bungalows, animals' homes?

*Can you describe them are they short, tall, wide, what colour are they?

Physical Development

*Can you create an obstacle course in your garden or home where you must wriggle and slither under objects and jump over objects?

*Can you put your own coat on and zip it up?

Literacy

*Shaving foam mark making: Can you make some marks in the shaving foam?
What patterns or shapes have you created?

Add some paint to make new patterns.

*As you walk up the stairs can you count each step? How many are there?

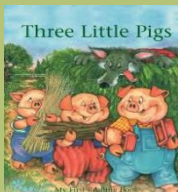
Understanding of the World:

*Can you make a bird feeder to hang in your garden? (lard, bird seed mixed together and rolled into a ball then put in the freezer for a few hours)

Once you have hung your bird feeder out what birds can you spot? Discuss what they might be with your Mummy or Daddy?

Phonics: Phase one:

Eye Spy: but something that is a colour or shape: "Eye spy with my little eye something that is..... a black circle (a car wheel). Make sure that it is possible for you all to see the item and take turns in guessing and describing the item.



School Readiness Activities:

(Pre-school children)

- *Dressing yourself, putting your own socks and shoes on and doing up a zip.
- *Being able to use the toilet on your own, including washing and drying hands on my own.
- *Cut up own food or open some wrappers/packets myself.
- *Talk about what I like and dislike.
- *Be able to listen to others and take turns in conversations.
- *Be interested in listening to stories and looking at pictures in books.
- *Understand and follow some rules.
- *Be able to talk about myself and my feelings. (Keep practicing the tasks above and try out some of the news ones below as well)
 - *I like asking questions and testing my ideas out.
