Phonics: Phase one:

Listen to the beat Use a variety of percussion instruments to play different rhythms. Remind the children to use their listening ears and to move in time to the beat - fast, slow, skipping, marching, etc. Keep the beat simple at first (e.g. suitable for marching) then move on to more complex rhythms for the children to skip or gallop to. \*Be interested in listening to stories and looking at pictures in books.
