<p>Maths</p>	<p>Times table are so important to making maths accessible, so any practise will benefit your child to keep their skills up and to learn new facts. <p>Reading</p>	<p>Regular reading will help children to keep up their fluency and comprehension skills. Just 10 minutes 4 times a week can make a huge difference.</p>
