



Reading at home:

There are numerous benefits of sharing a story with your child. In addition to strengthening the bond between parent/carer and child, story time sessions:

- · help children to associate reading with emotional warmth and fun When children are cosy and comfortable, reading aloud to them can even lower their stress levels.
- · help children develop a love for story and reading.
- · develop early reading skills i.e. how to hold a book, turn the pages, follow the words, look at the pictures, read from left to right etc.
- · develop speech and language skills; steady pace, exaggerated voice, emphasise sounds, good sentence structure etc.
- · builds vocabulary
- · cultivates imagination.
- · promotes attention and concentration skills.
- · establishes a bedtime routine

We will begin our book lending library on Monday 7th December. Your child will be sent home a book of their choice on the first session of the week. Please return the following week so that they can be quarantined for at least 72 hours. We would be grateful if you could share your child's response to the story each week via Tapestry e.g. a photograph with a quote, your child's favourite story, a drawing to illustrate their favourite part of the story.

Make a Shape!

You are being sent home 4 lolly sticks and we would like you to see how many shapes, patterns and designs

your child can make! This is a great open-ended maths challenge! There is no right or wrong and the possibilities are endless! The important thing for your child to realise is that no matter how the sticks are arranged, there are always 4 of them. This is known as the 'conservation of number' and is the recognition by a young child that quantity does not change with physical rearrangement. It takes them a long time to realise this!

Rea Class

In year one, readers develop their segmenting and blending of many different vowel sounds in phase 5. Regular practise of reading at home underpins their phonics journey. Children read lots in school throughout the day, in guided reading, after lunch, during every phonics session. However, research shows that children who read regularly at home make good progress in their reading. We ask you to please keep up regular reading at home and say thank you and well done to everyone who has been achieving this.

Year one phonics will be introducing some of the split digraphs (a—e 'bake a cake; e-e 'Pete the athlete'; i-e 'nice smile') and spelling our phase 3 and 4 tricky words from the back of our reading records.

Year 2 will be learning about the s sound spelt as a c before e, i and y. eg circle, ice, icy, and continuing work on making accurate choices of vowel sounds. We will continue to work on spelling our year 2 tricky words and the next 200 high frequency words from the back of the reading records.

In maths this week, we have been learning about odd and even numbers. Activities will be set in mathletics that allow your children to practise this and other mental maths skills they have learnt so far this year.

School Lunches

We have had notification from the Trust Manager that the kitchens at Lacon Childe will commence the new school lunch menu (attached and below) from Monday 14th December. Orders will need to placed on the Squid payment system in the usual way. Any orders (for sandwiches) which are already on the system for that week and beyond, will be cancelled and you will need to re-order from the new menu.


As previously advised, staffing lunchtimes and breaks is very problematic therefore lunch will be served in a 'take away' style. We are starting with a 1 week menu and as time progresses hope to expand back to the rolling menu. This is very much an interim measure, we will be looking to extend the menu in the near future.

In order to staff this, toilets will return to being cleaned once a day. We feel, within our risk assessment, that this is acceptable as we are fortunate enough to be offering each bubble / class their own set of toilet facilities.

The cost of meals will remain at £2.30 or government funded for children receiving free school meals (children in YrR - Yr2 and families receiving benefit related free school meals).

Would parent/carers please order a week's worth of lunches in advance so as to allow for planning and ordering of supplies.

There is also a Christmas festive meal attached to the one week menu and which is planned for 21st December to make lunch on this day a little different and special for pupils.


