Following last night's announcement we now know that the earliest we will re-open to all pupils will be the 8<sup>th</sup> March. We will be given plenty of notice to confirm this. We have not been informed of any further positive cases since last Friday and therefore we are planning to re-open to children of critical workers and children with other particular needs from Monday 1st February. We will presume that attendance (school, wrap around and nursery) will be the same as before this isolation week. IF THERE ARE ANY CHANGES TO ATTENDANCE PLEASE LET US KNOW ASAP. If you have any of the symptoms on the right (including precautionary symptoms) please book a test before the right (including precautionary symptoms) please book a test before returning to school. You choose the option: 'My local council or health protection team has asked me (or someone I live with) to get a test, even though I do not have the symptoms' when you book a test online. # Learning Pack Arrangements:

- We will be keeping to the same routine. We will aim for packs to be ready from 3pm. Drop off and collection points as before.
- PLEASE SANITISE HANDS BEFORE COLLECTING AND DROPPING OFF PACKS (BOTTLES WILL BE AVAILABLE AT DROP OFF POINTS)
- IF YOU ARE ISOLATING (DUE TO CLOSE CONTACT OR POSITIVE RESULT) PLEASE LET US KNOW AND DO NOT COME UP IN PERSON TO COLLECT YOUR PACK. PLEASE GET A FRIEND OR NEIGHBOUR TO HELP AND DROP PACKS AT YOUR DOOR OR LIAISE WITH US AS APPROPRIATE. CHILDREN'S WORK SHOULD NOT COME BACK TO SCHOOL UNTIL AFTER THE 10 DAYS ISOLATION SO KEEP IT AT HOME AND WE WILL VALUE AND MARK IT AT A LATER DATE.

# Free School Meals (FSM)

Parents/Carers who believe their child may be eligible for free school meals should make an application online through the Shropshire Council Website. This not only benefits parents by funding of a school lunch but it also, currently, gives access to the voucher scheme (£15 per child per week). Parents registered for FSM also brings extra income into the school to support children. The process is confidential.

The Council is now using a new system for free school meals applications that can provide an initial assessment of your eligibility automatically.

# School Lunches

With regard to ordering lunches:

• Would you please select your child's choice of sandwich on the Squid payment system. If your child is in Reception / Y1 or Y2 they will qualify for the UFSM (Universal Free School Meal) - however, packed lunches to be provided for Nursery children and Y3/Y4/Y5 & Y6 will be chargeable. The charge will be £2.30 per lunch.

If you do not place an order on Squid for a packed lunch, we will assume that you will provide a packed lunch for your child.

We cannot guarantee a lunch will be provided if you have not ordered it on the Squid system. It is therefore essential that orders are placed on the Squid system, please order for the week—this enables the kitchens to plan supplies.

Please DO NOT order any further than 12th February.

#### Information for week commencing 1.02.2021:

- The science for this week will need adult supervision because the children will need access to boiling water.
- The children will need other house hold materials to complete their activities (bowls, glasses, salt, clingfilm). They will also need a cold plate, so put this in the fridge or freezer in the morning ready for the lesson in the afternoon. The children will need ice for the lesson it would be great if they could have a go at making their own ice the day before and explore what happens when water turns from a liquid to a solid.
- Because adult assistance is required for the science lesson, I will make sure all the resources and the plan are available all week to fit in with parents' work days.
- The science lesson will mention thermometers, but the experiment can be completed without a thermometer.


