Covid 19 Update

Thank you for people's positive attitudes to requests, this week, to do PCR's following a positive case in school. We are all finding our way with the new measures and with the balance between maximising undisrupted, high quality, face to face education and reducing COVID 19 transmission. **If any pattern of cases emerges I will keep you informed and adjust school measures.** Currently, there is no indication of a pattern but be reassured we are monitoring and will keep you informed. A reminder of the current approach:

- We are currently running a 'step down' risk assessment. The school is operating normally while promoting good hygiene; testing, isolation and management of positive cases.
- People who have Covid symptoms or have a positive PCR result have to isolate (10 days).
- Close contacts of positive cases will be notified. Close contacts do not have to isolate if they: are **fully** vaccinated/ are below the age of 18 years 6 months/ have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial/ are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons). **Close contacts are asked to do a PCR and regular LFD tests.** If your children are informed they are close contacts (of cases outside school) please let us know and confirm test results.
- Please be reassured that, for the vast majority of children, COVID-19 will be a mild illness and that, in addition, the vaccine programme is providing protection.
- **If we get a pattern of cases we will 'step up' our measures to some or all of those previously used.**

KEEPING CHILDREN SAFE

Please do not let children play on the bike/scooter racks before and after school. Children are not allowed to play on these during the school day. A child had a nasty accident some years ago; they are not designed for play and, as they are for bike and scooter storage, are not on a surface to support if children fall.




Daily Reflection or Prayer

This week we have enjoyed thinking about:

- The achievement of Emma Raducanu: we don't know what we are capable of until we try—and sometimes we surprise ourselves with what we can do
- When continuing to reflect on the phrase 'no outsiders: everyone welcome everyone different, we have reflected on how much we value our special homes. Children have thought about how hard it must be if home is no longer safe. We have thought about the refugees from Afghanistan and what they will need if they need to move to safer places.
- We found out about the Jewish Yom Kippur which focuses on putting our mistakes right. Children thought about how we do this with each other (courage to say 'sorry' and courage to forgive and say 'it's okay').

Rea Class

In our phonics next week, we will be focusing on phase 4 blends for year one, while revising our phase three sounds from last year.

In our spellings and phonics next week, year 2 will continue to revise their sounds from last year and begin to look at year 2 homophones.

Homework - Children have bought homework books home. This week we are starting with writing. Year 1 children only need to write one sentence. English writing homework for year one is about sharing their writing with parents. Please do not spend a long time on this. Year 2 children need to write more than one sentence about the picture.

Spelling folders have been sent home to children in Rea class, with their spellings to learn. These are based on recent spelling sessions in class. We advise a short amount of time practising each day and children have been learning to use the Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check strategy in class. There will be a spelling test on the following Thursday. Regular spelling practise will really help your children with their writing in school. Thank you.

Severn Class

Today children in Severn Class had a visit from PCSO Jacqui Fletcher and PCSO Shelley Hyde, this was the first of six sessions in which the police will be covering leadership skills, citizenship, community awareness and giving the children an insight into the diverse work of the police.

We would like to present Nancy with a gift from us all to thank her for all her hard work — if you would like to contribute please hand your donation into the office.


