## Daily Reflection or Worship:

### This week:

• We thought about that if we expect people to forgive us for our mistakes we should also forgive others. We used two stories: one from the Bible (Matthew 18: 21-35) about a King who showed mercy for one servant's debt, but, who then didn't show mercy to another servant who owed him money and an up-to-date story about forgiveness when someone forgot something.





- We considered the story of The Lost Son (Luke 15:11- 32) and the forgiveness of the father when he returned after wasting all his inheritance. The story shows the unconditional love of a father (and God).
  - Open the book retold the Easter Story (Good Friday and Easter Sunday). Children have been given Easter story books to enjoy and reflect upon.

The children watched a lovely Easter Worship and message from the Diocese of Hereford (our wider church family)

### FINAL COVID UPDATE

**Covid presents a low risk of serious illness to most children and young people**, and most of those who are fully vaccinated. Due to high immunity in society, a greater understanding of the virus and improved access to treatments, we can now focus on how we live with COVID-19. **Unless the school see a significant outbreak we will no longer be informing parents of cases. TESTING:** 

# Pupils or staff in education settings are not expected to routinely test themselves for COVID-19. VACCINATION:

We continue to encourage people to follow the vaccination programme.

From April, healthy 5-11 year olds will also be offered the COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccinations will take place outside of schools in vaccination centres, pharmacies, GPs and walk-in centres. Parents of 5-11 year olds will receive a letter from the NHS with further information. <u>Online bookings</u> for 5-11 year olds will open in April

### WHEN TO STAY AT HOME:

- Anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result is advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be three days.
- If you have symptoms of a respiratory infection, such as COVID-19, and you have a high temperature or do not feel well enough to go to work or carry out normal activities, try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people, until you no longer have a high temperature (if you had one) or until you no longer feel unwell.
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.
- Avoid close contact with anyone who you know is at higher risk of becoming seriously unwell if they are infected with COVID-19 and other respiratory infections, especially those whose <u>immune system means that they are at higher risk of</u> serious illness, despite vaccination.

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting. All children and young people with respiratory symptoms should be encouraged to cover their mouth and nose with a disposable tissue when coughing and/or sneezing and to wash their hands after using or disposing of tissues.

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# Reception & Pre-School Summer Term Friday Forest Fun

During the Summer term your child will be participating in 10 weekly Forest Fun sessions. The sessions will be run by our trained Early Years Team and take place on a Friday afternoon at Pool Meadow, Stottesdon, a natural woodland area the Muggleton family have kindly volunteered for the school to enhance our outdoor learning opportunities.

During our Friday Forest Fun sessions, children will learn about the natural environment from first hand experiences. Children will explore, play, and learn using a range of activities (both designed by the leader and chosen by the children themselves). Activities will include den-building, learning knots, creative making, using natural materials such as clay and willow, tool skills and cooking on a campfire. These activities develop a sense of independence, problem-solving skills, social skills, and teamwork which are important life skills for our children.

A voluntary contribution of £25 (£2.50) per session will cover resources to support our outdoor learning, hot chocolate, and marshmallows, along with extra staffing to support lower ratios. Please make payment via our online Squid system.

Please ensure that your child has the following clothing to change into each Friday:

- Outdoor shoes walking boots or wellingtons
- Warm socks
- A warm coat preferably waterproof
- A jumper or fleece
- A t-shirt
- Trousers
- Waterproof over-trousers if possible
- · An extra layer of clothing depending on the weather

Please write your child's name on their clothing.

Your child will come home in their Forest Fun clothing unless they are attending an after school club.

To help with the running of Friday Forest Fun, we would like to ask for a parent volunteer to attend each session. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact Mrs. Martin or the school office, where there will be a sign-up sheet. Adult volunteers who attend Forest Fun need to make sure that they are dressed appropriately for the weather conditions, including a waterproof jacket and sensible footwear.

### Standard Assessment Tests (SATS) at KS1 and KS2

As we head to the summer term, children in Y2 and Y6 will be doing the standardised assessment tests that are used in England. These assess children against the age-related expectations as set out by the National Curriculum. The KS1 SATs are internally marked (by the teachers) and used to inform teacher judgements. The KS2 SATs are externally marked (they are sent away with results being returned to the school around 2 months after the tests are sat). No-one should worry about these assessments, but instead see them as an opportunity to show the skills they've learnt and what they can do.

### **Book Request**


