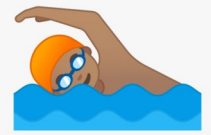
Nursery's Talk for Writing: Mad about Minibeast

If you would like sibling photographs taken, (there is no obligation to purchase at this point), would you please let the office know.

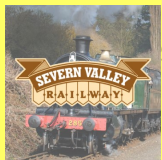

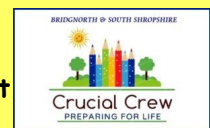
Year 4

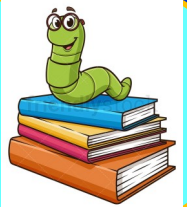

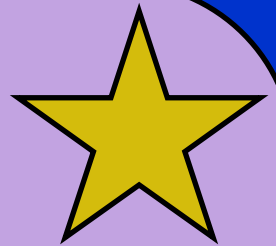
