
Daily Reflection or Worship:

• Open the Book bought us the story of 'The boy (Jesus) in the temple' and how important it is that we all have people who love us and we can trust.




Phonics next week for year 1 will be su as in treasure, si as in vision, dge as in bridge, y as in crystal and ge as in large.
