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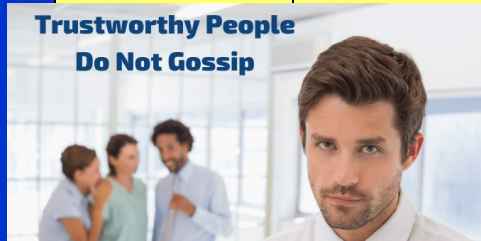

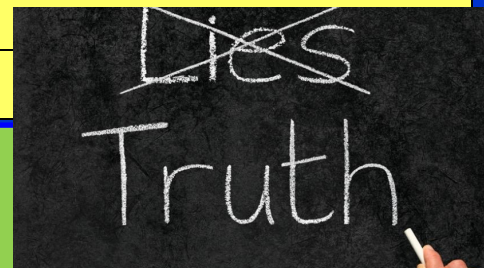

- On Friday we celebrated our wonderful Y6 leavers. There will be more in the school news next week (after their residential) to celebrate this further.



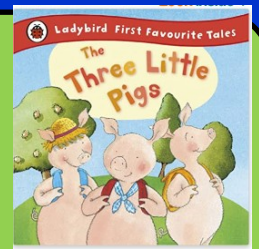
