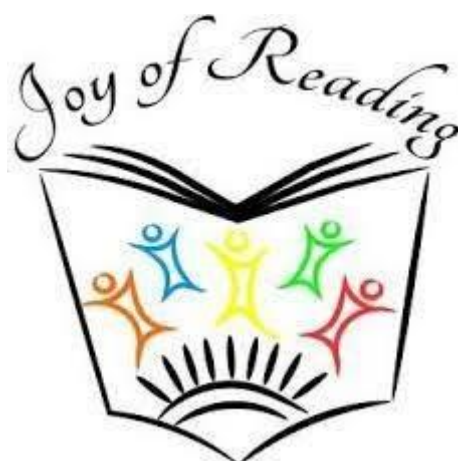

New Management Information System



The Trust and school is currently moving over to a new system to manage the majority of information and processes. This, although stressful initially, will support efficiencies and effectiveness long term (as well as being cheaper!). Parents may start to notice we are now able to text information (the number it comes from is +442520660274). We will continue to use Squid, for our meals and school shop, for the rest of this year but from September we will be using Arbor. The system will also mean that we should be able to book parents evening appointments, nursery and wrap around places online. We need to take it one step at a time but hope to be sending you further information before the end of term.



Rea News

Year 2 Spellings Retrieval to end the year over the next week will be: apostrophes for contractions; el le and al at the end of words eg medal, jewel and little; dropping the e from a split digraph when adding a suffix starting with a vowel eg smile becomes smiling and smiled; wr making the r sound as in write; doubling the last letter and adding a suffix starting with a vowel after a short vowel sound followed by a consonant eg bat becomes batter an batted and batting.

Phonics for year one will be:

- su and si making the zh sound as in treasure and vision.
- dge making the j sound as in ledge and fudge.
- y making the l sound as in gym and crystal.
- ge making the j sound as in change and large.

Homework for Rea class is:

- **Reading** regularly (at least four times) and practising your sounds from the back of your reading record..
- 15 minutes **numbots** (TTRS year 2).

Maths

In maths we will be focusing on place value of larger numbers.



Year 1 will be exploring the composition of two digit numbers in a variety of contexts eg coins, part whole models etc.

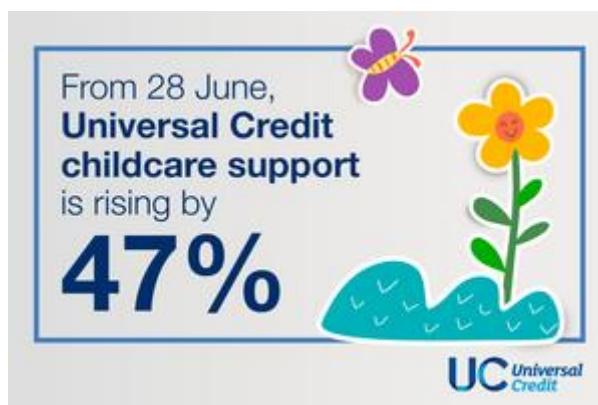
Year 2 will be reviewing calculation strategies taught so far this year.

Summer Holiday Fun in Shropshire with HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) – Bookings Open!



Bookings are now open for the Summer Shropshire HAF (Holiday Activities & Food) programme.

There are free places available on the programme for children and young people aged 4 (reception class age) to 16, who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals. There are also a limited number of free places available for children and young people living in areas of high deprivation and/or from low-income households, who are not in receipt of benefits related free school meals. These children and young people can be referred onto the programme by a professional. Places are also available for Ukrainian families, currently staying in Shropshire with host families.

Toilet Project at St. Marys Church, Stottesdon

Please see message below from Chris Tibbits regarding the Heritage Project news.

As a school we use the Church a lot, if you are able to support in anyway it would be very welcome.

Here, at last, is an opportunity for everyone in the community to contribute to the project: it has always been our intention to provide a toilet facility as part of the massive restoration investment at St Mary's. Sadly, as much more than planned had to be spent eliminating the dry rot and replacing the roof coverings with 33,000 new tiles, we are **short of between £20-25,000** to meet this most 'basic of needs'. We should explain that, with no mains drainage on site, the loo is not a cheap facility.... it has to be 'off grid' composting toilet since a septic tank is not appropriate in a churchyard. **So this is an urgent call for financial help to complete the job** - we have a most generous grant from the Shropshire Historic Churches Trust and a donation from one local business to get us underway can you help towards the remaining £11-15,000?? Please get in touch if you might be able to assist - and thank you so much for thinking about this!
