Our overview curriculum map aims to give a snapshot of the rich experiences and cycle of learning our children are submerged into. In addition, teaching and learning will reflect children's interests.



<u>As communicators we will be</u> taught key vocabulary:

Head, eyes, nose, mouth, ears, hands, knees fingers, knee, feet, toes, arm, leg, animal. Family; mum, dad, sister, brother, grandparents, cousins, aunt and uncle, similar, different, Harvest. Senses; Hear, taste, look, touch, smell.






As explorers we will be learning to describe ourselves and our family members. We will be able to identify similarities and differences between ourselves and others. We will be able to name simple body parts.

As writers we will be introduced to Dough Disco. Encouraging children to draw freely. Complete fine motor challenges. Begin to make snips with scissors.

The Makaton signs we will be learning this term are:



In Phonics we will be learning to tune in our attention and listening ready to hear letter sounds in Autumn 2.

Activity to support this at home

Go on a listening walk, this can be in your garden. Ask your child to listen. Can they hear the birds tweeting? Can they try to copy the sound? Can they hear vehicles? Do the vehicles sound close, or a long way away? Can they guess what sort of vehicle it might be? Does is sound like a large vehicle such as a truck or is it a car? In PE we will be exploring multi-skills. Different ways of moving to be explored with children - use of space games. Cooperation Games.

As artists we will be beginning to use representation to communicate, e.g., drawing a line and saying 'That's me.' Draw a person with some identifiable features. Begin to hold and use drawing tools (pencil, rubbers, crayon, pastels, chalk, pen, felt tip) with some control to make marks (from observation or imagination).

We will learn to use a variety of tools to apply paint (brushes of different sizes, sponges, fingers) We will learn to recognise and name colours.



• We use kind and gentle hands and feet.

- We walk inside Nursery.
- We use our insides voices in Nursery.
- We share our toys in Nursery.
- We use our listening ears.

As mathematicians we will be:

- recognising, naming and matching colours.
- beginning to begin to show an interest in counting aloud verbally to 5.
- able to 'give 1' when asked.
- able to play with shapes and begin to make pictures with these.
- able to complete a simple jigsaw.

Vocabulary : Count, number, one, colour, colour names, number songs. Shape, shape names, together, new shape, pictures and images, jigsaw, missing, turn

Every Wednesday afternoon in **Music** the children will be following the Music Express Activities "Special People". With a focus on Pulse and Rhythm, playing instruments with increasing control to express their feelings and ideas. We will begin to remember and sing entire songs
